PROGRESS REPORTS:

Progress reports will be sent home with students on **Friday**, **November 20, 2020**. The Elementary Progress Report Card is designed to show student's development of learning and skills,



and work habits during the fall of the school year. Additionally, its purpose is to provide parents and guardians with information on their child's general progress in working towards the achievement of the curriculum expectations in all subjects. The progress report supports constructive discussion between teacher and parents/guardians.

PARENT—TEACHER INTERVIEWS: Interviews will be organized for the week of November 23 to November 26 via phone or Google Meet. More information will be forthcoming from your child's teacher.



REMOTE LEARNING CODE OF CONDUCT: The following are expectations for our Remote

students:

- The remote learning platform is a classroom;
- Students attending remotely are expected to show the same classroom preparedness and willingness to follow school and classroom rules, routines and expectations as if attending in-person (i.e., attending class and being punctual, being presentable and dressed for learning, having learning materials ready and homework completed);
- Students are expected to be prompt and in attendance by the start of the school day. Any students who are late will be marked late and parents will receive a call from Safe Arrival.
- As in a regular classroom, remote learners are expected to show courtesy, respect and consideration for their teachers and peers. The school's code of conduct and progressive discipline apply in instances of inappropriate behavior; and

 Where there is inappropriate behavior, the teacher will report the incident to the principal for further investigation and follow-up with parents.

Parents of Remote students should note the following:

- All student absences must be reported via the Board's Safe Arrival procedures;
- The remote class is imbued with the same sanctity as a regular classroom;
- The teacher is the person of authority in the classroom and is responsible for establishing and maintaining class order and management;
- When there is any concern (i.e., live feed is not working), the parent will call the school office to report the occurrence and wait for school administrator to respond;
- At all times, where there is concern about content, the parent will contact the teacher through established teacher-parent communication protocol including a phone call or email to the teacher. Additionally, the parent can also contact the office with any concerns.
 Parents are not to use the chat feature to address concerns.
- Taking pictures, video or audio recording of the live proceeding is strictly forbidden to ensure the privacy of staff and students.
- Providing unwelcome feedback/comments about the proceedings of classroom lessons on social media is inappropriate.
 Any comments should be addressed directly with the teacher.
- Under no circumstance during synchronous live teaching will a parent or guardian interrupt the proceeding of the classroom. As outlined in the Education Act s.212 (1), 'it is an offense for any person to willfully interrupt or disquiet the proceedings of a school or class.'

Safe and Caring School Community

PARENTS/GUARDIANS ON THE SCHOOL YARD:

We respectfully ask all parents and guardians to stay off the school yard area. Please wait behind the fence, kindly wear a mask and maintain physical distance. Thank you for respecting our school's entry/exit routines.

DISMISSAL: A gentle reminder to all our students and parent community that when the bell rings, students must follow whatever home time safe arrival procedures have been established by parents and guardians.

STUDENT ABSENCES: Once students enter school, it is recommended they remain at school until the end of the school day. Wherever practical and possible, we ask that parents and guardians schedule appointments for students outside of school hours. Accumulated student absences can adversely impact a child's learning. While we understand that certain appointments cannot be rescheduled, we kindly ask that this be an ongoing consideration in scheduling appointments. If appointments must happen during school hours, please inform your child's teacher and/or the office. For our Remote learners, these students must use SafeArrival when communicating student absence and/or late. This will also minimize disruptions to the classroom. In addition, a gentle reminder that it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to notify the school of a student's absence before the morning bell. This helps our safe arrival program run more efficiently, supporting our ability to ensure all students are accounted for at school. The few minutes it takes to make this important call saves us much time at school, and supports us to do the best job we can. We thank you most sincerely for your cooperation in this matter. Contact information for our safe arrival program is on page one of this newsletter.

Please note the following for REMOTE Learners: Students are expected to attend live instruction just as they would as if In-Person. Attendance is recorded twice daily in the morning and the afternoon.

In Person learners who are absent GREATER than one day can access synchronous/live instruction.

COVID UPDATE:

Throughout the month of November, York Region Public Health is hosting a digital campaign intended for youth. This campaign is to remind children and young adults that the *Choices You Make Matter*. The posters can be accessed here.

INCLEMENT WEATHER:

Winter is just around the corner and with that in mind, <u>please remember to dress children appropriately for outside conditions</u>. Hats, gloves, scarves, and boots will keep your child(ren) warm during recess. It is also recommended to have an extra pair of clothes at school in the event that they get wet as flurries arrive. <u>Please note we are not accepting drop offs of winter clothing items in the office.</u> Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately when he/she leaves home in the morning. We will continue to do our part by reminding students to dress warmly for recess.

FORGOT SOMETHING?

Please refrain from dropping off forgotten items such as clothing, technology, homework, lunch etc as these items will not be permitted into the building. Further details can be found on the school board website, under YCDSB re-entry Plan.

SOCIAL WEBSITES: Our school is obligated to protect our students' and families' personal information. Images of students are considered personal information. Parents sign the *Freedom of Information* consent form upon registering their child with our Board. This consent, when signed, allows pictures to be posted on the School Board's or school's website. We caution all parents and staff that when taking pictures during school activities or field trips that those pictures, when they include students, NOT be posted on any social networking sites or apps. Thank you for respecting this rule.

PARKING LOT SAFETY: Everyone must feel safe and welcome when they come to our school, and that begins in our parking lot. We highlight parking lot safety in our newsletters so our community is aware of our parking lot expectations. We are grateful for the support of our parent community, our community liaison officer, and municipal parking officers for their guidance, cooperation and support.

KISS AND RIDE: Thank you to parents and guardians for your efforts to use SMAL's Kiss and Ride effectively before and after school. You are reminded that this area is not intended for parking or stopping, but rather designated for drivers to pull in, unload safely, and drive through. Parents and guardians, please continue to park in available parking spots or use of street parking where appropriate if you wish to accompany your children to/from the playground or kindergarten pen. Our collective efforts will make a real difference to the efficiency of morning drop offs and pickups, and most of all keep our students safe!

FIRE ROUTE: We respectfully remind our community not to park or idle in our bus route, entry or exit gates. This area is for buses and emergency vehicles. Vehicles parked or idling in this area block traffic flow which is a disruption to everyone. Please do not choose haste and convenience over the safety of our children. We also ask that drivers do not drive into the parking lot from the exit gate at the north side of the lot. The front driveway is designed for one way traffic only with vehicles entering, when appropriate, from the south entrance. This space must be kept clear as well for pedestrians and students on bicycles. Thank you for respecting these traffic safety rules.
